

LOVERDOSE FLAGS





Join the dance! Join the movement! Join the re-love-ution!






Having lived in Hong Kong for over 15 years, in 2018 Antoinette Rozan feels the need to express her need for appeasement in the face of a world plunged into increasingly strict and sclerotic political contexts. Strikes in Hong Kong, Covid19 crisis, calls for war in Europe and the Middle East, incitement to reject humanity's diversity... all this and more made her react and led her to draw XXL hearts in bright colours, countering the prevailing gloom. Through this universal symbol, she expresses simple and obvious messages, to make us aware of the urgent need to recreate cohesion, and to proclaim loud and clear the desire to be alive with one voice!

Since then, Antoinette Rozan has been exhibiting those flags in places that want to get involved and take part in this common project. In 2024, this series of works became part of a global project, LOVERDOSE FLAG. With its sights set on universal dissemination, on multiple media and formats accessible to all, this project is a genuine movement, driven by a deep desire to unite an evergrowing community around the values of Humanity, Peace and Love.

LOVERDOSE FLAG is calling on you to get involved and express the desire for vitality that's in all of us! Get in the dance, join the movement!








INKS ON PAPER OR CANVAS

After a period of meditation, Antoinette Rozan's creative hand has a vivid and spontaneous force. Ink becomes alive on paper, whether black and white or bright and colourful. They carry a strong message: remember to love yourself in order to shine with Freedom, Love and Joy for others.

Each of these inks is linked to the Yi Jing, one of the founding texts of Chinese civilization. They suggest the importance of the family, of living in the momentum, of the sky, of meditation... Inspired by the symbols and the spirituality of this philosophy, Antoinette Rozan begins this series, which will take an important place at the heart of her job.









COPPER SCULPTURES






FREE STORY

By its posture, FREE is a welcoming sculpture, calling us to open to oneself, and to fell respect for another and their particularities. Thanks to an astonishing balance, FREE can stand in various ways. Unlike a "static" sculpture, beyond a statue, it's in full motion. FREE in bronze, on it's own, embodies the Freedom to be Oneself.

Multiplied and next to each other, it gives the illusion of being different. All these sculptures come from the same mould. Like our DNA, they are identical. And yet, through their poses and attitudes, they become unique. FREE Story is a subtle expression of the illusion of our difference. It is a call for more respect between us.










JUST MOVE SCULPTURES
